They're back!

We are so excited to be able to announce that we have once again been successful in our application to borrow a digital technologies kit through STEM SHARE. We have received our P.C. Robotics Kit already so will be unveiling the gadgets this week and will start using them next week, continuing throughout Term 2. As we did last year, we will be focusing on problem solving, following instructions and innovative design as we learn basic coding skills. However this time, we will be using laptops to write the code instead of tablets and we will be instructing different types of robots. We are up for the challenge and extremely proud to be participating in such an engaging and innovative program for our 21st Century Learners.

We have access to four different kits...

Makey Makey: An invention kit where we will be creating things like our own gaming controls and testing the conductivity of items.



Grove Inventor Micro:bit: A pocket-sized computer with which we will be creating things like light displays and musical instruments.



Ozobot: A tiny robot which can trace shapes with a marker. We will be using our Ozobot to build an understanding of the very basics of coding by drawing different shapes using different colours to represent different commands.

Lego EV3: A Lego kit giving us challenges to build and code different robots to do different things (like the one in the picture).
