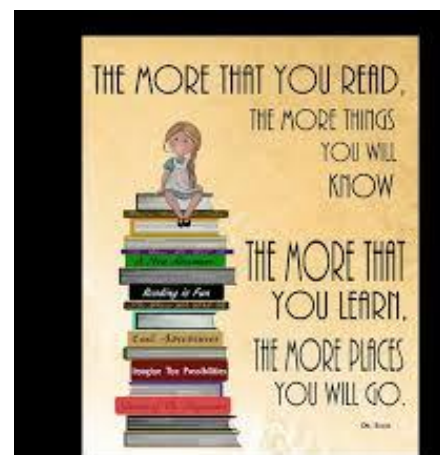

Experience a gyrocopter at the markets

AVIATOR JOHN Commerford will fly his Gyrocopter 'Blackbird' over the Chillingham Community Market on Sunday, August 11, at 10.30am.

At noon the 63-year-old pilot will land the aircraft so market-goers can view the ultra-light up close and discuss the joys of recreational flying in the Tweed.

Mr Commerford, who started flying his gyrocopter ten years ago, said he will be showing off the versatility of the ultra-light. "I am going to be doing some manoeuvres to show the capabilities of the gyrocopter," he said.

"They are often used for mustering because of their extreme manoeuvrability." The pilot said the aircrafts have gained popularity in recent years due to their inexpensive purchase price, low running costs and safety record.

"I always wanted to fly but it was always out of my price range," he said.

"Gyrocopters can do ninety per cent of what a helicopter can do at ten per cent of the price so they are the poor man's helicopter."

"The gyrocopter was originally designed to overcome the stall characteristics of an ordinary fixed wing aeroplane and they are a rotary wing aircraft so they are very safe."

"You can't stall a gyrocopter and they say they are the safest aircraft in the world due to their ability to glide down if the engine fails."

Having already tested that theory and lived to tell the tale, Mr Commerford said

he is now an even bigger fan of the aircraft that was invented in the 1930s.

"Part of your training is that if you have an engine out then you have to do an out landing where you land outside of the airport so you train to glide down if the engine fails," he said.

"I used that training when I had an engine fail and glided down in a horse paddock in the Burringbar ranges."

Despite often being dubbed the motorbikes of the sky, Mr Commerford said that the ultra-light is not known for its speed.

"I named my gyrocopter Blackbird because I've painted it black and also because the Blackbird is the fastest aircraft in history whereas this is the slowest, so it's a very ironic name," he said.

Having developed a taste for flying, the semi-retired landscaper said he now finds it hard to keep his feet on the ground.

"I go up once or twice a week depending on the weather," he said.

"Some gyrocopters are fully enclosed but the Blackbird is open frame so I don't have a cockpit or a windscreen so I have to make sure the weather is fine when I fly."

"I think I love flying so much because it's one of man's greatest achievements and Leonardo Da Vinci said that once a man knows how to fly he'll be forever looking skyward and I am always looking up at the sky and wondering if it's a good day for flying."
