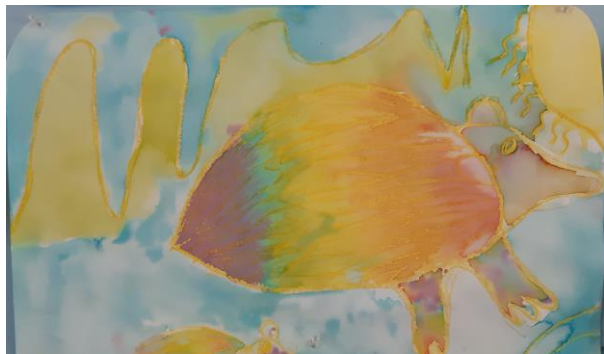
SUCCESS THROUGH TEAMWORK

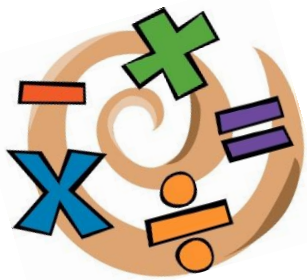

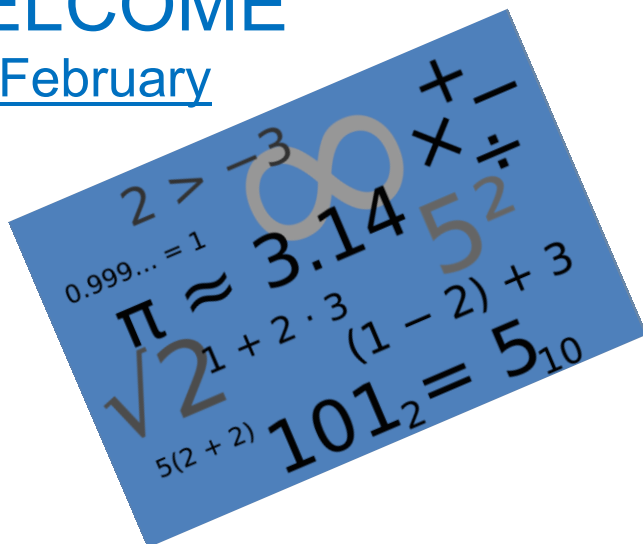


