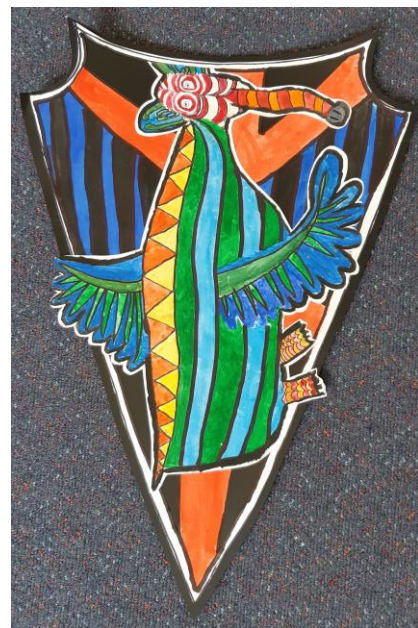


## COAT OF ARMS

The Term One's theme in art for Years 5 and 6, has been "Fantasy". Students began by exploring the history of how coats of arms were used historically, before creating their own. Their creatures were 'reconstructions' of qualities and characteristics of different animals that, together, would represent their family or themselves. The students were very engaged and imaginative!

### Marley's coat of arms description

I chose an elephant head so my creature can hear from enormous distances with those enormous ears. I picked an indestructible turtle shell so my creature can defend itself from fearsome predators and can use it for a place to sleep, away from home. The wings are for speedily soaring over mountains, vales and lakes. My creature also uses its wings to hunt, by diving on its prey and killing it.



### Bejay's coat of arms description

I chose this black stork's head because it is as stealthy as an FBI agent. It could catch any fish better than a fish trap! It has a sword-like beak to stab its prey as a predator. I chose a turtle-frog's body because its skin is like titanium so no predator can get it. But if a predator does get it, it puffs its body up. I chose the black stork's feet because I thought it could walk on water and keep its body above it, so as not to scare fish away. I picked the chameleon's horns to wrap around a predator and kill it with its horns.



### Noah's coat of arms description

My hybrid animal consists of a marmoset, a wood turtle, a crowned pigeon and a rattlesnake. The main body is a marmoset, because marmosets are intelligent, witty and clever at many things. He is holding a deep pink and vibrant yellow flower; the very same plant he was born under. He is thinking about how he is an old marmoset hybrid and when his children might be born.

The visible wood turtle body part is the shell, symbolizing the strength of his mental capacity. He is both mentally and physically clever and strong. On his head, he has a horn, as sturdy as a freshly made piece of steel. He inherited it from his grandpa! When the marmoset goes into hiding, his horn looks like a tuft of grass, enabling effective camouflage.

His rattlesnake tail is lethal. His alarming colours and patterns, alert other hybrid animals of his danger. Normal animals don't know that they end up as his meal. He eats a variety of things; mainly fruit. My hybrid animal makes a fabulous crest.


