Life Education – Healthy Harold

We had a fantastic day of learning yesterday with Healthy Harold. The students participated in activities and lessons that promoted safe and healthy choices. The Life Education program is specifically tailored to each stage level, to build social and emotional learning in children.

Our students were delighted by Harold the talking giraffe and his carer Nicole, who brought lots of fun, games, and interactive activities to our classroom.

K-2's program was called <u>Ready Set Go</u>. Using a school athletics carnival as an example, Healthy Harold and students learn how to prepare physically and mentally for important events in their lives. Key messages include eating a healthy meal, staying hydrated and ways to deal with nerves during a challenging situation.

Years3/4's program <u>bCyberwise</u> explored a range of contemporary issues including recognising the body clues that warn us about unsafe or potential predatory behaviours and learning how to react to risks and report problems online. Online privacy and respectful relationships were also covered.

Years 5/6's program <u>Relate, Connect, Respect</u> discussed empowering students to develop positive, safe and respectful relationships – both face to face and online – through understanding and respecting themselves and others.
